

Fifth Sunday of Easter

I am the Way

INTRODUCTION

Few of us would set off on a journey to a place we had not been to before without a map or some guide to take with us. Nobody would set off with no idea of how to get there, for then we would certainly get lost! Today Jesus tells his disciples that they already know the way to the place he is going, even though they have never been there before. We will see how confused they became and how Jesus explained all that they needed to know!

SIGN OF THE CROSS

LIGHT THE CANDLES

Light the candles and say Candle Prayer 3.

SORRY

Ask the children to close their eyes, and read this prayer slowly:

Father, forgive us
if we have hurt anyone
by our thoughts or actions.
Help us to forgive
those who have hurt us.
We ask this through Jesus, our Lord.

GLORIA

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

To welcome today's Gospel sing Acclamation 2.

GOSPEL (JOHN 14:1-6)

Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not be afraid or worried; trust in me as you trust in God. In my father's house there are many rooms, and I am going there to prepare a place for you. Then I shall come back to take you with me, and we will be together again. You already know the way to the place I am going."

Thomas felt unsure and asked Jesus, "Lord, how can we know the way, if we do not know where you are going?" Jesus answered "I am the way, the truth and the life. Through me you will know how to find my father's house."

DISCUSSION

Why did the disciples feel anxious and afraid? Because Jesus had told them that soon he would be leaving them. When Jesus talked about going to his father's house, where do you think he meant? He was talking about heaven.

Jesus said that he is "the way." Do you know what he meant? The word "way" can have several different meanings. Ask one of the children to demonstrate the way to brush their hair or wash their hands; this shows us how to do something. Then ask another child to explain the way to their house; this tells us how to find a place. Jesus is "the way" because he shows us what we must do so that we can find heaven.

When we are born, we begin our journey through life, following Jesus who shows us the way towards heaven. Our signposts which guide us as we travel are God's commandments and all the things Jesus taught us. If we follow these signposts and do what pleases God, then we will find the right path which leads us to everlasting happiness.

ACTIVITY

Depending on the age range of the group, either have the children draw around their feet and then cut out the "footprints," or give out small foot cutouts to be colored. These can be used to glue onto a large path of the "way to heaven," with signposts to help show the way.

CLOSING PRAYER

Before Jesus was born, the people of God used to sing and say prayers and poems called psalms. In this psalm they ask God to show them the way.
